### IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF MEXICO FOR SLAUGHTER HORSES EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by U.S Origin Health Certificate issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and the consignee. Additional information shall include:

#### OTHER INFORMATION

- 1. The slaughter horse(s) will be consigned to a Federally inspected Mexican slaughter plant and the truck will be sealed at the inspection point in the United States.
- 2. All animals will be unloaded and inspected by a Mexican veterinarian at a facility in the United States at one of the following border points: Brownsville, Texas; Laredo, Texas; Del Rio, Texas; Eagle Pass, Texas; El Paso, Texas; Presidio, Texas; Columbus, New Mexico; San Luis, Arizona; Nogales, Arizona; Calexico, California.
- 3. The animals must be transported in cleaned and disinfected vehicles, and not contact any other animals during their transport.
- 4. The U.S. Origin Health Certificate must be typewritten. Mexican Port Veterinarians will reject any certificates that are handwritten.
- 5. The enclosed appendix of bilingual certification statements may be used and attached to the health certificate (VS 17-140). The health certificate number and federal endorsement must appear on this attachment.
